Dear Members and Friends,

What’s next? That’s the question we are asking ourselves here at Mason City First Presbyterian. At our congregational meeting on September 21<sup>st</sup>, it was made clear that we cannot continue as a congregation in our community without making some significant changes. The financial reality is that without changes we will work through our reserves in two or three years. Thankfully, we can make changes that will bring us into the future God has for us in which we can continue to serve our community and to worship and grow in our love and knowledge of God through Jesus Christ.

As your Session has looked at next steps, we would like to do two things: provide for continued life together as a congregation and discover how we can continue to serve God’s mission with all of our resources into the coming decades. There are several things we, as members of the church, will need to commit to in order to move us forward.

As we move forward there are four areas in which our financial standing can be improved. First is to encourage those who already contribute financially to stretch a little more in their giving. The second is to ask those who are members and friends but do not give regularly to consider doing so. Given the increase in costs and the loss of members this last year, we estimate that without any change in giving we will be \$50,000 short next year which would need to come from our reserves. However, if everyone were to increase their giving by 5% and everyone would commit to giving something during the year, that shortfall could be significantly reduced. This would give us all some breathing room to make plans for our future. Nevertheless, we know that some cannot give more because of their situations and no one should be giving out of a sense of guilt.

The other thing we must do as we move forward is to invite others to join with us in serving Christ in this place. Sharing your faith and inviting others to join with us can be scary and intimidating. Early next year I will be offering some workshops on understanding and growing comfortable with sharing the Good News and how it has impacted you personally.

It may be that we can thrive and continue doing church in a traditional way with a growing commitment to giving and witnessing. Regardless, we must still consider the changing landscape of religion in our times and how God is calling us to respond. The Session intends to begin exploring possible ways of utilizing our property to both benefit our community and generate new forms of income to be used for ministry. In partnership with the Presbytery of North Central Iowa we will investigate using the Good Futures Accelerator program through Rooted Good. While we are moving forward into an uncertain future, we are doing so with a faithful God. I hope we can all join in committing to continue servicing God, one another, and our community as First Presbyterian. It will be an exciting journey of faith.

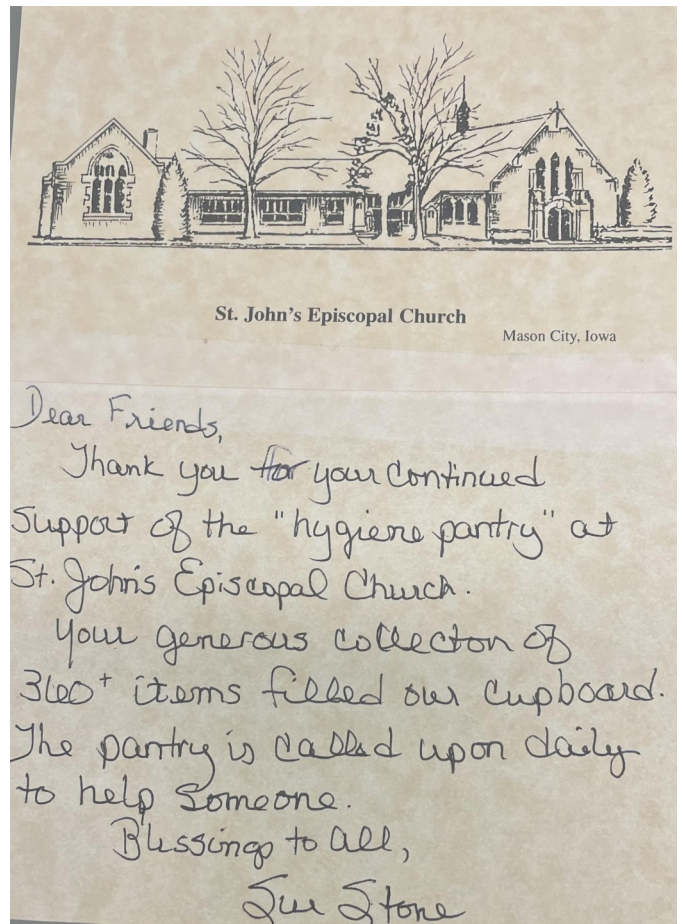
Dear Friends,

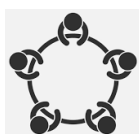


## Bible Study Opportunity

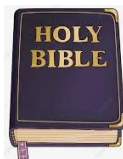
